Topic: EIAC Appointment

Recommended Board motion:

Appoint Marty Tuttle, Chief Legal Counsel for the Montana Department of Commerce, to the Employee Investment Advisory Council (EIAC). Mr. Tuttle will replace Edward Dawes as a state employee representative on EIAC.

Mr. Tuttle, received this J.D (With Distinction) from University of Pacific, McGeorge School of Law, in Sacramento, CA, in 1987. After 7 years in private practice, he moved to Montana and began work for the Montana Department of Environmental Quality. During his tenure at DEQ, he worked on legal issues concerning petroleum storage tank, hazardous waste, and hard rock and opencut mining. As Deputy Chief Legal Counsel he was the lead attorney for the state in the Pegasus Gold Corporation bankruptcy matters and the ensuing complex negotiations with the major insurance companies which issued environmental cleanup surety bonds in favor of Montana.

In September 2001, he was hired into his current position. Over the last 14 years, he has worked closely with the Montana Board of Investment on many issues. In addition, he has worked extensively with the Montana Finance Authority and the Montana Board of Housing regarding the issuance of tax exempt bonds to raise proceeds to meet program objectives.

He has received Governor's Awards for his work on behalf of the state from both Governor Racicot and Governor Schweitzer. His favorite time of year is early May, in odd-numbered years, and when he isn't hiking Mount Helena he is probably poking around his yard. He currently resides in Montana City with his wife Michelle, their sons Aaron (UM Western) and Sean (Helena High), their dogs Hana and Bella, and their bird Paco.

I recommend that board approve the appointment of Mr. Tuttle to EIAC for the three year term beginning August 1, 2015 ending July 31, 2018.
